Careers update

This term, Year 8 pupils took part in a 'Guess My Job' workshop at Wood End Lane. They interviewed a range of employers, including Bevan Brittan LLP, Willmott Dixon and the DWP, learning about their job, the work they do, the skills and qualities that are needed and qualification routes. Well done to all the Year 8s for their great engagement!

In the final weeks of term, all pupils in KS4 and 5 shall have the opportunity to take part in *IGD Virtual Work Experience Week*, gaining an introduction to industry, sales and marketing, food science and engineering and learning how to showcase their employability skills.







Summer Curriculum Snapshot

<u>English</u>	KS3 pupils have been developing their descriptive writing skills by using a range of literary devices. KS4/5 pupils have been analysing key documents such as contracts of employment and exploring a range of professions as part of their careers topic. We have also had the chance to enter a Young Writers competition - thank you to those who have entered!
<u>Maths</u>	In KS3 pupils have been learning about Measures, including time and distance. KS4 pupils have been learning about Handling Data and how to represent data in different forms using the mean, median, mode and the range. All pupils have enjoyed our weekly maths quiz and have done well. The winners are congratulated during the head teacher's assembly.
Science	Pupils have enjoyed exploring fun facts in science for example, 'If we connect all our blood vessels end to end can it go around the world?' Their learning has been focused on the function and structure of the heart and the path that blood takes through the heart to get to the head and body.
<u>IT</u>	Students have been engaging in the world of stop motion animation. This hands-on project combines art, technology and critical thinking skills to create captivating short movies and requires animating objects and characters using a frame-by-frame technique.
<u>PSHE</u>	Pupils have accessed sex and relationships education at age-appropriate level, consolidating their understanding of sexual health, contraception and consent. More recently, pupils have begun to explore media literacy and digital resilience.
<u>PE</u>	KS3 pupils have been developing their skills playing Tennis focusing on forehand, backhand and serving. KS4 pupils have been participating in singles and doubles games and using volleys and introduction of spin to try and outwit opponents. Unfortunately the Tennis trip to the Rothersay Classic in Birmingham was cancelled due to the weather.
<u>Humanities</u>	Pupils studying GCSE History have been engaging in revision activities that have helped them prepare for examinations that have taken place this term. Well done to those who have sat their exams!
<u>Art</u>	Students have been creating their final piece of art work for display and they have enjoyed working with the graffiti artist Panda to help create two large graffiti murals at Woodend. Ks4 students have been learning about digital art and how they can manipulate photographs.
Citizenship	Pupils have focused on rights and responsibilities, exploring the UK justice system including civil and criminal law, UK court structure and sentencing powers, using guidelines to 'be the judge' and evaluating the effectiveness of custodial sentencing. They have also explored human rights, assessing how well they are protected around the world and investigating situations where rights are in conflict.
